Unwrap the Joy: Guidelines for Holiday Decorations

By following these guidelines, you can ensure that your decorations contribute positively to the festive atmosphere.

Most everyone was understanding and pleased with the info that was presented. All funds for this are available from proper accounts and NOT causing any assessments or shortages from needed funds. The work should begin when permits are issued and take approximately 60 days. There should not be a great deal of disruption but please be patient as it is worth it.

There are a lot of things happening, and we are on top of the issues that need our attention now and trying very hard to get ahead of those which are coming in the near future. Pickle Ball / Tennis courts are moving along and have a lot of moving parts to the job so again we ask for your patience. We are going to be adding several more cameras for security and to protect against vandalism. We are moving on this as quickly as possible. More to come as it develops.

In closing, I want to thank each and every board member, especially our treasurer Pattie who works tirelessly to keep us on track and informed, and committee members for their dedication and very hard work to make The Meadows what it is. In August, the Welcome Committee had its first meeting for new residents. This meeting was an opportunity for new residents to ask questions about The Meadows rules and regulations and meet members of the Board, as well as meet each other. When moving into a large community like ours it can be overwhelming and having the ability to ask questions helps to have everyone on the same page. Maintenance Updates

Equipment Repairs

During recent lightning strikes the resident gate, pool FOB system and cameras at the playground and tennis courts were damaged and later repaired. Some cameras will need replacement.

Pool & Playground Maintenance

In July one of our five pool pumps failed, and our pool contractor replaced it. We also had two pool heaters/chillers repaired under warranty. Maintenance staff have painted the fence and gates surrounding the pool and playground area.

Irrigation

Recently, four mainline irrigation pipes were repaired, and two timeclocks and 12 irrigation valves were replaced. One of our pump stations is showing its age, Repairs were made, and it is functioning as it should. If replacement is necessary, reserve funds have been set aside.

Painting

Paint bid specifications for the first phase of Ridgewood Capris have been sent out to qualified contractors.

Road Maintenance

In order to improve the safety of our roads, rumble strips near stop signs were installed and a crosswalk along Waterfall Blvd. has been painted.

Landscaping

The landscape committee and board are working with Xtreme Landscaping on enhancing the landscaping in the common areas. The funding for this was part of the negotiations with Xtreme Landscaping who will provide all the funding for this \$30,000 project.

Tree Trimming

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CPM tree division has completed the Sable Palm and deciduous tree trimming in Greenwich and Lakemont. CPM will complete the Sable Palm and Washingtonian Palm trimming throughout The Meadows. Xtreme will trim the remaining deciduous trees. If you see a neon yellow ribbon on oak trees, please do not remove the ribbon as these trees are identified for trimming.

Fertilization & Pest Control

Our fertilization pest control contractor will be putting down an application of Fire Ant bait and fertilizer in both the lawn and shrubbery beds.

Votes Are Tallied: Results Are In

In July, a letter and ballots were sent to all homeowners regarding three approved amendments to the Governing Documents. Articles XVI, XVII (building paint) and Article XX (which streamlines the amendment procedure to simply provide approval by 51% of the Unit Owners voting in person or by proxy). Ballots were returned and counted on August 18, resulting in approval of all three amendments. Thank you to those who voted!
